If a team completes before 1:45, competition ends.

Denise and Pat will be on hand with a sample scarf and will help you get started on this beauty.

The scarf is based on a 9 row pattern repeat and does require a bit of counting.

We plan to complete at least one 9 row sequence that afternoon.

The finished scarf is lightweight and cozy and can be worn several ways.

For this project the supplies needed are: -24" size 5 circular needle (size 6 if you are a tight knitter)

-1 Skein of variegated sock yarn (prefer #2 weight) OR

at least 60 grams of assorted sock yarn left-overs.

We'll have some sock yarn scraps on hand to supplement your stash)

-Pattern is FREE on Ravelry and we will have copies available.



#### Please be comfortable

with the following stitches: cast on, knit, and purl This pattern features the Central Double Decrease (CDD) stitch and we will demo it if that stitch is new to you.

This project is somewhat time consuming, so we will gather again on March 8<sup>th.</sup> to answer questions and cheer each other on !

The **ukelin** is a stringed musical instrument made popular in the United States in the 1920s. It is a <u>bowed</u> <u>psaltery</u> with <u>zither</u> strings, and its name derives from the <u>ukulele</u> (which was first made in Portugal but was popularized in Hawaii) and the <u>violin</u>. It lost popularity prior to the 1970s because the instrument was difficult to play and often returned to the manufacturer before it was completely paid for. (Wikepedia)

National Freedom Day commemorates the date - February 1, 1865 - when Abraham Lin-

coln, who was the nation's president at the time, signed a joint resolution that proposed the 13th amendment to the United States Constitution. The amendment was made to outlaw slavery and was ratified on December 18, 1865.

Major Richard Robert Wright Senior, a former slave who founded the National Freedom Day Association, played a crucial role in creating the observance. Major Wright was deemed as a community leader in Philadelphia and was active in education, the media, business and politics. He hoped to see a day that would be dedicated to celebrating freedom for all Americans.

The first commemoration of such a day took place on February 1, 1942, although it was not made into law yet. A tradition of laying a wreath at Liberty Bell also began. On June 30, 1948, President Harry Truman signed a bill to proclaim February 1 as the first official National Freedom Day in the United States.
