- A recent addition to the society's collections is a photo of General John Pershing pinning the Distinguished Service Medal on the uniform of **Brigadier General Edwin Winans Jr.** at Dierdorf, Germany in 1919. Winans, born in Hamburg in 1869, was the youngest son of Michigan's 22nd governor; his military career took him to Mexico, Cuba, the Philippines, and France and later included a term as superintendent of West Point.
