Register Your Kids Now for **History Day Camp!**

Ever wonder what it was like to grow up in the 1800s? Your kids can find out firsthand at a new learning adventure called Camp Looking Back, to be held from 9 am to noon on July 14 and 15 at the museum.

Camp content has been designed to appeal to 7- to 9-year-olds. Day 1 will focus on the everyday lives of Native American children who once made Hamburg Township their home. On Day 2, campers will be able to compare what they learned the first day to the lives of the "new" American children who settled here with their families in the 1830s. There will be plenty of hands-on activities for kids to take part in, from **fun-filled games** to authentic chores including grinding corn and making butter. A midmorning snack is included in the camp's cost of \$75 per child.

A NEW MARKER

Deby Henneman, parks and recreation coordinator for Hamburg Township, is leading an effort to update the 1980s-era Michigan historical marker at Hamburg and Strawberry Lake Roads which honors Hamburg and its most famous resident. Governor Edwin Winans. Historical society board members Suzanne Hines and Joyce Terry, museum administrator Pat Majher, and Winans biographer Valerie Winans contributed to the text, which has been sent to the state for approval. Fingers crossed, we'll have a new marker and a marker reveal!—by the end of this year.

WHAT'S NEW?

• The museum just got accepted into the national Blue Star Museums program—the first museum in Livingston County to receive this distinction. That means we'll be offering **free admission to active-duty service men and women** and their families (a total of five relatives each) this summer. A valid military ID is required.



- Starting in June, we'll be hosting Imogene "Imi" Soma, a sixth-grade student at Livingston Classical Academy in Whitmore Lake. Imi will help with a variety of projects relating to the society's summer events and also learn about the many skills that go into running a museum.
