# THE SOLUTION ~ A slipper Knit Along at the Museum!

Join us on Saturday, January 25, 12:00 pm-1:30 pm for this basic slipper project. Gals and Guys age 10 and up Registration Required (see details below)



For our January knitting we will use the pattern "CLOUD SLIPPERS" by Adrienne Sullivan, It is FREE on Ravelry and we will have copies available at the Knit Along.

Participants for this Knit Along should be familiar with casting on, as well as both knit and purl stitches.

Denise and Pat will be on site – with slippers on their needles too. They will answer questions about the pattern and cheer everyone on as their yarn magically becomes a cute slipper or two.

#### Required supplies:

- ◆ Size 15 needles (or size 13 if you knit loosely ) ... Pat prefers to use a 24" circular for this project
- ◆ Tapestry Needle for weaving in the yarn ends
- ◆ 55 90 yards of SUPER BULKY (#6) yarn depending on chosen size
- Note: This pattern supports shoe sizes from lady's small to men's large

Embarking on a knitting project will likely take you to the local craft store to purchase yarn. Before that retail option became available, yarn was spun from sheep's' wool using a spinning wheel. You can see a historic spinning wheel up close in the main gallery at the Hamburg Township Museum.

Fun fact: According to the state census of 1874, sheep outnumbered people in Hamburg Township 4,921 to 877!

## The Story Behind The Brand



The graphic H (which stands for "Hamburg") is made up of two parts. The vertical elements are cross sections of railroad tracks representing the 19th-century technology that prompted the early development of Hamburg Township. The horizontal element illustrates the abundance of water that drew new businesses and families to the area in the 20th century and continues to do so today.
